Walk like an Egyptian



Have you ever played football for 5th to 12th grade? Yes. It is my first year as a head coach.


How long are you gonna coach for? As long as Mr. Smith will let me.

Coach Edwards likes to run and workout, fish, hangout with people, hunt, and watch sports.


He went to Auburn for college, been married for 3 years, and has a wife.

The word he says the most at football is "Little things matter."







12 cup regular sugar

1 tablespoon chili powder 1½ teaspoons ground cumin

1 teaspoon sea salt

1 teaspoon ground black pepper

½ teaspoon ground paprika

¼ teaspoon garlic powder

¼ teaspoon onion powder

 $\frac{1}{2}$ teaspoon crushed red pepper flakes

¼ teaspoon dried oregano

Mix chili powder, cumin, salt, pepper, paprika, garlic powder, onion powder, red pepper flakes, and oregano together in a small bowl until combined. Store in an airtight container.
